#### The Pandemic

It has been a long two years for all businesses including ours, not to mention the disruptions to the lives of everyone in the community.

Our pandemic response has focussed on staying open and accessible to our existing patients. The has meant taking steps to maximise infection control within our surgeries to protect patients and staff. Many of our patients will have noticed the measures which have been in place to achieve this. 2022 will be another year of actively preventing transmissible illness at our surgeries by use of masks, distancing, outdoor consultations, in-car consultations where appropriate and telephone and video consultations for patients with a high likelihood of infectious illness.

"Double vax" status is likely to become a necessity for entering the surgeries in 2022 but we can still offer outdoor or Telehealth consultations to unvaxed patients.

#### Adult Vaccination Recommendations

Influenza vaccination - annual vaccination is recommended and is free if over 65 or in younger patients in "at risk" categories (ask your doctor if in doubt)

Pneumococcus - a single injection after age 70 (free)

Shingles - a single vaccination after age 60. It is free between the ages of 70 and 79 inclusive.

Tetanus - Booster at age 50 if no boosters in the previous 10 years. Thereafter vaccinations are given for tetanus prone wounds if no vaccination in the previous 5 years

Pertussis (whooping cough) - every 10 years whilst in close contact wth unvaccinated infants eq young grandchildren. Approximate cost \$40. This vaccine includes a tetanus booster also.

**Covid 3rd doses** - at the time of writing it is recommended to have a 3rd dose of vaccine 5 months after the second dose. Currently Pfizer Comirnity or Moderna Spikevax are the recommended vaccine options for the 3rd dose.

## **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### How can I tell if my doctor is available this week?

If you have internet access check <u>https://</u> boonahmedical.com.au/index.php?id=appointmentsavailable to see which doctors have appointments available in the next 7 days.

#### How early can I ring for an appointment?

Officially 8:30am Monday to Saturday but there's no harm in trying from a bit before 8am.

## Which of your doctors visit the Fassifern Retirement Village?

**Drs David Eviston and Nicole Taleon supported by Drs Nigel Kwok and Jeremy Norden** will be seeing patients in the Fassifern Aged care facilities.

#### My child's vaccinations aren't up to date.

The childhood vaccination schedule is predicated on the vaccinations being administered at the recommended time. If the child is now considerably behind the schedule please make an appointment to discuss a catch up plan with one of the doctors. This will involve collating the previous vaccination history and determining which vaccines need to be administered and the correct interval between vaccines which cannot be co-administered.

Please bring your child's vaccination record (baby book) with you to that appointment.

#### Do you perform skin checks?

Yes we do. In order to perform a thorough check it is best to dedicate the appointment to the skin check only.

If an abnormality is found it will either be flagged for future review, biopsied or fully excised, in which case the specimen will be sent to the pathologist for final diagnosis.

Skin checks are usually repeated annually but in some cases more or less frequent reviews might be recommended.

Skin checks are billed as consultations as documented in our fee policy and qualify as part of our annual cap on gap fees.

Skin cancer excisions or biopsies (if required) are not included in the annual fee cap and will incur out of pocket fees of \$80-\$110 depending on the cost of disposables. and sterilization.

#### How can I best make sure I stay healthy into old age?

Become mindful of your behaviours! Don't smoke, don't overeat, maintain weight in the healthy range. Young males need to be mindful of avoiding alcoholrelated impulsive behaviours and especially of driving misbehaviours.

If stressed or sad see your doctor to discuss.

Make sure your doctor knows of any family history of diabetes, bowel cancer, breast cancer or early heart disease. Have at least one full skin check by the age of forty.
